AUSLAN

This term in Auslan (Australian Sign Language), students will learn how to sign different sports, countries and other vocabulary such as ceremony, spectators, medals etc, which will link to the Olympics 2024. As students are learning these new signs, they are translating familiar words and phrases from English to Auslan and vice versa. They are also using visual cues, noticing how signs and words differ. They will be creating digital texts such as posters or cards that use both Auslan images and English words.

HEALTH & PE

Welcome to Semester 2 Para Hills parents and caregivers. I am eager to be back at school to continue our learning with R-6 students this year. In term three, we will be working with junior primary students to review and refine the fundamental movement skills we have worked so hard on in semester one, incorporating them into small games and problem-solving activities. Students will also be working through more of the Child Protection Curriculum, exploring relationships, Rights and Responsibilities, and Trust and Networks. Students will also have Beatz dance lessons, beginning in Week 3.

Middle and upper primary students will transfer their game sense skills into a new focus area with the 'Having a Ball: Net and Wall' and 'Over the Net'. Middle and upper students will also be engaging with the Child Protection Curriculum, unpacking a number of Health, and Community and Personal Safety topics. They will also see themselves finishing up their Golf Coaching Sessions with Golf Australia, taking part in various SAPSASA events including athletics and soccer (based on selection), whilst middle primary students will also have Beatz dance lessons starting in week 3 and a tennis carnival in week 9.

What is a Pastoral Care Worker?

Pastoral care workers (PCWs) are employed under the National Student Wellbeing Program. As the school's PCW, my role is to provide supports that focus on the social and emotional wellbeing of students. I am available to students in the yard at break times, work alongside teachers and students in the classroom, with written parental / caregiver consent, provide individual support to students and I am an extra resource to teachers for school events and excursions. I also run small groups for children on friendship skills, as well as to develop social skills using the *Kimochis* and the *What's the Buzz* curriculum. We are beginning our social skills groups this term by looking at HONESTY, one of our school values. Our younger students will be learning how honesty means telling the truth. This is a value we can all choose to model. When we are honest, our friends and people around us can rely on us and trust us. Sometimes children (and adults!) lie to avoid an unfavourable outcome. However, if we have done something wrong, the best thing that we can do is be honest. If we have lied, it's important to say sorry and then tell the truth.
